Greetings to all in the name of our Lord and Saviour,

Our executive has had 3 meetings at Ballarat. Planning for the 2021 LWA convention is progressing and at the midterm council meeting, when representatives from each state will attend, details of theme and final confirmation of venue will be revealed. All information regarding the 2021 Convention will be available in later edition of Lutheran Women and on the LCA General Convention of Synod site with a link to LW registration page. Mark the date in your calendar 23rd September to 26th September, 2021.

Membership numbers for LWA 2019 stood at 3083. This year's numbers won't be evident until all states have forwarded their member donations to the LWA treasurer.

CONVENTIONS

In April the 52nd NSW convention was held in Henty, with the theme "The Light Keepers" Matthew 5:16. It was a privilege to attend this and meet a number of your ladies.

In early May I attended the Western Australian 50th Convention, with the theme "Women in Faith", Ephesians 3:20-21, where a number of South Australians joined in a wonderful celebration.

Upholding our sisters in Christ in this way is where love comes to life.

Later in May I also attended SA/NT, 53rd Convention at Para Vista with the theme "Radiant with Hope", Romans 15:13.

Irma Dymke and Irene Geer deputised for me at the 53rd Victorian Convention, which was held on the same day as the WA convention. The VIC theme was "Walking in Wisdom", Proverbs 2:6a and they also reported on a wonderful gathering, hearing about the projects they support and with encouraging and challenging Bible studies and devotions throughout the day. The Queensland convention/ retreat which are held every two years, I shall be attending this year, travel permitting.

LWA Magazine is a wonderful subscription showcasing projects supported by Lutheran women. I hope that you have enjoyed the contributors of personal stories, as this year we have been following through a theme "In everything give thanks". Our Bible studies have been challenging and the monthly devotions wonderful. We love to hear your stories of your guilds/fellowships, so please keep sharing these; they are an encouragement to all. Thank you to your immediate past President Roslyn Zadow for her lovely devotions through 2019.

Thank you to Grace Bock, editor and Maureen Turner, collator/proof reader and to Felicity Evans of Creative Minds in producing a first class magazine. This year has seen the introduction of a digital edition of the Lutheran Women's magazine. I encourage you to share this information in your congregations, with the young and the older. You may like to give a subscription to a granddaughter or younger friend, sharing what you most value about your faith and the how the projects you support change lives.

We continue to support the ALC Pastoral Students. Monies donated are held in a separate account of Lutheran Women. On behalf of LWA Executive Joan Zilm is the co-ordinator to the students and meets with the students and their wives to let them know of the support from Lutheran Women with our prayers and also financial help should any emergency arise. They receive a copy of the Lutheran Women's magazine and a gift of \$200. This is to help with incidentals at the beginning of their studies.

All LWA Projects have been well supported and a total of \$73,661.05 has been distributed were allocated. This is 'mind blowing' and on behalf of all the agencies, a sincere thanks to all LWA members and friends for your generosity. We give thanks to God for the support you give through your State guilds/fellowships donating not only to the 11 LWA projects but also to your individual state projects.

Lutherans For Life Report

"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; but I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." John 10:10.

We live in a society which is contradictory in its claims. Our Queensland Premier says every life is important, when talking about the COVID 19 pandemic but she has boasted about bringing in new abortion laws which are some of the world's most liberal, where the unborn can be sacrificed right up until birth, even though babies can live from 24 weeks gestation with the help of current technology.

GOOD NEWS: If LNP comes to government in Queensland's next election they have committed to revising the abortion laws. They have voted at their convention this year that babies born alive during failed abortion, which are older than 20 weeks gestation, must be given medical care, whether the care is palliative, comfort care, or life sustaining care. This is a movement in the right direction, as presently these beautiful little babies are left to die, with no care. Our current State Government is focused on bringing in laws to facilitate Voluntary Assisted Suicide. They have stated they will not bring it in until after the election, but that statement could change to an earlier time.

VOLUNTARY ASSISTED DYING (VAD) is actually voluntary assisted suicide, where the doctor facilitates a patient in taking their own life.

EUTHANASIA / ASSISTED SUICIDE / VAD

<u>WHAT IT IS:</u> A deliberate action by a doctor with the intention of taking a human being's life at the request of the person. A deliberate action by a doctor, in facilitating and enabling someone to take their own life, at their request. A doctor deliberately hastening the death of someone (e.g. administering a level of pain relief intended to end life at their request).

<u>WHAT IT IS NOT</u>: Refusing or discontinuation of medical treatment, which is burdensome or is futile. Ceasing or non-commencement of extraordinary measures of a life-sustaining nature e.g. life support machines. Administering strong pain relief to a terminally ill or critically injured person, with an unintended consequence being the death of that person.

EUTHANASIA, THEN ASSISTED SUIDICE AND VAD ALWAYS HAVE THE INTENT TO TAKE A HUMAN LIFE. THEY ARE ALL FORMS OF KILLING

No matter how many laws are put in place to protect the vulnerable, these laws can be ignored or changed as we have seen in the case of abortion law, over the years. Please **PRAY about this bill, write to, or visit your local member**, with requests for more available palliative care, rather than VAD. This is an urgent matter.

NOTE: Queensland should have the equivalent of two Palliative Care Specialists per 100,000 population. But we have the equivalent of ONLY 0.7 per 100,000 . (not 70% per 100,000 as has been reported) Ultimately, the intention of palliative care is to maintain the comfort and dignity of the individual. The intention of VAD/ euthanasia is to end life (to kill).

Australian Lutheran World Service: Report for Convention 2020

Your heart for making a difference: You haven't met Ajok Kuir Atem.

And you probably won't – she lives in the remote community of Panyagor in South Sudan.

Yet, through ALWS, you have helped change her life – as just one of hundreds the Lutheran Women of Queensland who helped with donations totalling \$8,281.60 since 1 January 2019.

Hear what you have done for Ajok by training her in catering:

"It is hard as a woman in life because we have many jobs to do each day. Coming to the course I still had to try and fit in all my usual cycle of activities. It took a lot of time and effort to come, but it was worth it. I enjoyed learning new skills, my cooking has improved, and it will empower us as women.

I thank God for the courage of those like you who give money to help us here in South Sudan. We are in poverty, but you are empowering us to do something for ourselves. I pray to God you can continue so that you can help more women."

From Brassall to Wondai, 25 separate Queensland Guilds brought love to life in places like Ajok's village through ALWS partner LWF (Lutheran World Federation).

Reverend Daniel Deng, Bishop of the Episcopalian Church in Duk County – who lived in Toowoomba for 14 years! – asked ALWS to tell you:

"I would like to pass on our great appreciation for LWF in this County. We appreciate the heart of LWF to respond even in times of insecurity and hardships. It is clear you have a heart for people. You share God's love. Here in South Sudan we still love God. People here are praising God regardless of the challenges. We have suffered much, but we are still praising God. We thank the Australians that you have a heart for making a difference. Keep it up Australia!"

LCA International Mission

Like most years, 2020 began with great promise and full diaries for the staff of LCA International Mission. Pastors had flights booked to teach in Malaysia during the early months of the year, a women's conference was scheduled in Myanmar, scholarship holders were eagerly anticipating time at Australian Lutheran College, and plans were a foot to provide intensive training for the emerging leader in Biblical Reconciliation in Indonesia. And then came COVID-19. And with that, many of our well laid plans had to be rethought overnight. The joyful reality is that although we have not been able to be present with our overseas partners as planned, the ministry of gospel has continued, and in some cases, exploded during this time of lockdown and hardship.

In all of this we give thanks to God for the faithfulness of Lutheran Women around Australia who remain our biggest supporters as we partner with churches in Papua New Guinea and South East Asia to proclaim the love and mercy of God in the crucified and risen Lord Jesus. Your ongoing support, even during the strictest times of lockdown in this country, has ensured our partner churches have not felt abandoned. In fact your continuing support of the projects LWA committed to for this synodical term has been a great blessing to churches trying to hold on to some aspect of normality.

Many stories can be told of the joy Papua New Guinean mothers express when they are given the birthing kits you put together. Although some places like Bethany Home (Malaysia) and Home of Praise (Thailand) had to be temporarily closed, the staff continued to support mums and newborns with love and care at Home of Grace (Thailand) thanks to the support of Lutheran Women. Wok Meri training continued in Papua New Guinea, as did the installation of solar panels providing critical electricity to Lutheran Health Centres, not to mention Hanna Schulz's uninterrupted work translating the Scriptures and Mick Hauser's teaching at Martin Luther Seminary. And thanks be to God, we've even been able to help scholarship holders stay up to date with their studies thanks to the gift of technology and the commitment of staff at Australian Lutheran College. Of course, there are also challenges which have come about because of the restrictions. Most of our partner churches serve in communities where everyone lives hand to mouth and so economic shut downs have caused a great deal of hardship and in some places, threatened famine. On YOUR behalf, LCA International Mission have been able to access reserve funds to provide essential food and sanitation items to help people through this trying time. Assistance has been provided in Myanmar, Burundi, Indonesia, Cambodia and the Philippines, with our other international partners working with us to ensure other churches have not gone without.

While this kind of Christian aid is not our 'regular business' at LCA International Mission, we could hardly turn a blind eye to the plight of our dear brothers and sisters who are suffering in ways we can only imagine. Inspired by St Paul's words in Galatians 6:9-10, we have responded on your behalf that the people we serve may know the love of God in both word and deed. When asked whether a congregation in Cambodia thought food or classrooms were the priority at this stage, the pastor replied, "There's not much point having classrooms if all the children die from starvation." We want to thank you, the Lutheran Women of Queensland and all members of the LCA for enabling us to undertake this holy work on your behalf.

We don't know what the rest of 2020 will look like. What we do know is that the Lord is still busy and active, growing his church as our brothers and sisters in Christ bear witness to the hope they have in the midst of the uncertainties of life. A hope that is even more relevant at a time of hardship and despair. As we have been forced to stop and reassess the work we do on YOUR behalf, what has struck us is the remarkable thread of God's grace that winds its way through the story of Australian overseas mission which traces its history all the way back to 1886. A story that has been made possible by the faithfulness and generosity of people like the Lutheran Women of Queensland and your passion for the mission of the church.

On behalf of LCA International Mission and all our partners – thank you! Thank you for partnering with us so that many more may experience the joy of being part of that story that has its beginning and end in the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.

World Day of Prayer Queensland Committee Report

World Day of Prayer is a worldwide ecumenical organisation which brings Christians in many countries together on the first Friday of March in each year to observe a day of prayer and to participate in a Worship Service. Each year the Service is prepared by Christian women from a different country. The 2020 Service was from Zimbabwe, with the theme "Rise! Take your mat and walk!"

The 2021 Service has been prepared by Christian Women from Vanuatu on the theme "Build on a Strong Foundation".

Through participation in the Worship Services those attending gain some understanding of the cultures, concerns and needs of the country and become aware of the unity in Christ being shared as well as the diversity of needs. The motto of World Day of Prayer is "Informed prayer Prayerful action" and this is affirmed through the prayers and actions undertaken through the Services and in many other different ways.

As this has been a difficult year, especially with the COVID 19 restrictions, this has impacted on the ability of some communities to hold a service. Services in Queensland were held in over 150 locations with attendance of approximately 5,000 people.

Current Representatives are Patricia (Tricia) Keddie from Taringa who has been on the Committee since February 2018, Esther Jones (Everton Hills) officially representing LWQ since 2009 but who has been attending Meetings since 2004. The Committee meets on the first Monday in February, May, July and August. The AGM is also held at the August Meeting. The last Monday in October each year is Packing Day held in the Baptist City Tabernacle Hall, Wickham Terrace, Brisbane when over 200 packages with service orders, discs (music and host country information) and other relevant information are collated for posting. Some of the packages are taken by representatives from different areas who are helping with the collation of the parcels. This is an extremely busy morning and extra helpers are always very welcome. The funds received from the services are distributed to various mission organisations including the Bible Society which receives the largest amount.

Unfortunately our last 12 months have really been defined by COVID-19 and its devastating impact on our ministry. As a ministry that is built around the gathering of young people for camps and training we felt the impacts of COVID-19 early. The pandemic has forced us to cancel:

6 holiday camps

15 training workshops in schools

50 camps at our campsites (thankfully 25 have rebooked for later this year)

Our gap year ministry

Our annual Brisbane Appeal Dinner

Thankfully this month we've been able to re-open our campsites, re-commence our In-school ministry and our holiday camp team are planning for September. Our prayer is that Queensland can avoid a second wave of infection so our ministry can operate with confidence again.

In contrast to the current challenges, our year started very positively with the opening of our new Ocean Outlook venue and associated dining room at Luther Heights Youth Camp – the first new accommodation building in over 40 years! It was a joy to celebrate the opening of these new buildings with many people in the middle of January this year. In time, these new buildings will allow us to influence 6,000 more people for the Gospel every year, which is an incredible opportunity for our church.

Through the highs and the lows we remain grateful for God's provision and guidance. We feel incredibly blessed to serve in His ministry and we're very grateful for the support of amazing ministry partners like Lutheran Women of Queensland who journey with us.


