Re-shifting our focus and opening our senses and heart to God centring around **Faith, Friendship and Service in the love of God** that will enrich us. With the added treat of 'No food preparations – No dishes in the sink'. Thanking God for the opportunity to delve into our word in the **Bible** and to experience a sense of **belonging** in you.

Naomi Marks, Pres. BS&GC Zone welcomed all present.

Our **Bible verse theme** for this weekend was from Proverbs 27:9 "A sweet friendship refreshes the soul". Let us be reminded of our aims as Lutheran Women of Qld.

- 1. To encourage deeper consecration and greater service to Christ and His church; in particular through the study of Scriptures and to share, especially with women the good news of God's salvation in Jesus Christ.
- 2. To co-ordinate and give impetus to the work of women of the LCA.
- 3. To foster the bond of Christian fellowship among women of the LCA Qld. District. With these thoughts in mind let us relax in Christ and build one another up in Christian love.

Naomi introduced the team leaders: Leanne, Colette, Shirley, Sharon, Sue, Narelle, Helene, Kay and herself. Explaining the importance of having a "Buddy" for the weekend.

Pastor Jordan Bennett – newly appointed Spiritual Leader for LWQ was introduced and asked to say a Blessing over the weekend.



Each table was decorated with an ocean theme and each session we moved to a different group thus meeting someone new each time.

Beach. Bible, Belonging: There is something magical about **the beach**! It is the magnitude of God's creation and how we are a small part of something huge. As we throw a beach ball around and between our friends, we are reminded that the ball is a circle – no beginning – no end! And we realise the treasures of **friendship.**

What does the Bible say about the beach and the river? We heard lots of Bible verses relating to both with the last one, Isaiah 66:12 "And behold the Lord said: I extend peace to her like a river."

Next, we took a **beach** excursion around the world (without leaving the room!) by looking at the power point of pictures of **Beaches** and guessing where they are situated on a map of the world provided on our tables, the narrator gave us clues for us to pinpoint on our map, which did test our knowledge of the world.

Supper and lights out ready for a new day.

Saturday Morning Devotion: Sunrises and sunsets at the beach are spectacular. We are in awe of the colours God paints across the sky. The beauty of the sunset fades to darkness so His stars can shine brighter. A small child's thoughts: The sun has to fade so the stars can come out and shine! Let's shine His light in the world He's placed us!

Praise time: followed by Discovering the Bible:

How do we find what's in the Bible?

God wanted to show how much He loved His people. So, he gave them a special book – THE BIBLE. 66 books – 39 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament.

When was the Bible written?

The Bible is a collection of writings, and the earliest writings were set down nearly 3,500 years ago. The earliest writing began when symbols were scratched or pressed on clay tablets. The Egyptians refined this technique and developed an early form of writing, known as hieroglyphics. And so, we learnt a lot of just how we have come to know and love our Bible. Finishing the morning with prayer; Thanking God for the life-changing truth of who we are and how He loves us.

Praising Him through singing - songs of praise. Belonging to God in Christ: For everyone, a place of belonging starts with our relationship to God: If we could ask God one question what would it be? How do we describe our relationship with God today?

One story of Belonging is told in Luke 7:36-50 Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

Belonging to each other in Christ. Eph.3:14-21 tells of Christ's love and power in the life of a believer. Paul prays for the church of Ephesus and the surrounding churches.

Relaxation before afternoon tea we participated in a Round Robin competitions by belonging to our groups and following the leader to participate in the games.

Saturday night dinner, our men folk joined in with a roast meal after a trip around the hinterland of the Sunshine Coast.

After the meal each group was presented with a script and given 30 minutes to prepare. Then, with minimal props and memorization, return a fantastic performance!! The **Bible** does not say "Blessed is the sourpuss" In fact this weekend we have discovered that the

FROM LWA PRESIDENT - Grace Kroehn

By the grace of God, we have journeyed through another year, coming together for times of bible study, fellowship, worship and in support of one another — in our home fellowships/guilds/groups and then at zone activities and state conventions and retreats — and also in our communities. I pray that you have all been encouraged and supported by your attendance and participation.

The mid-term meeting of the LWA Council was held in North Adelaide on July 26 & 27 2023. Pr John Gerhardy and Pr Paul Fielke presented the opening and closing devotions and provided valuable support to our discussions. Complete an update of the Constitution, and hear from representatives of various LWA Projects, and meet some of the officials from LCA National Office. Attention to financial matters, enabled the distribution of accumulated funds (totalling \$60,000) to various projects, the full details being provided in the October/November issue of the Lutheran Women Magazine.

\$10,000 from the Pastoral Ministry Students Assistance Fund has also been given to support the work of Pastor Julian Mazzeo, recently ordained as Pastor to the Adelaide Deaf Community Church whose worship base is the Pilgrim Lutheran Church, Magill SA. Accumulated funds in the ALC Pastoral Ministry Students Assistance Fund are invested in Term Deposits with the LLL. With only a small number of students, call for assistance has been minimal. There is

presently in excess of \$50,000 in this fund and we suggest that at this time, you may like to choose to direct your financial support to some of the other listed projects. The ALC Women's Auxiliary have chosen to go into recess. Only two units have been occupied by ALC student families, with all other units being commercially let and some sold. So this project also requires minimal support at this time.

The mission fields of South-East Asia and Papua New Guinea have continued through your generous support throughout the year. Our treasurer Beryl Smith has advised that at December 31, 2023 we have 2316 members, and a total of \$93,661.26 was distributed during 2023 to the LWA nominated projects. Thank you for your generous 'mission hearts.'

Many thanks to the Magazine team of Grace Bock, Felicity Evans and Maureen Turner, who put together a most informative and encouraging publication, with the Devotions and Bible Studies lovingly prepared for us. Please encourage on-going subscriptions or consider gifting a subscription.

The plans for the LWA Convention in Murray Bridge SA on October 2-3 are progressing well. Keep up to date via the LW Magazine, together with news from executive members attending vour conventions/retreats. anticipation I thank newsletter editors in our states for also providing convention information. Registrations will be available online and paper registration forms will be available upon request. I look forward to seeing many of you at Murray Bridge, when you will hear from an array of guest speakers who will acknowledge our chosen theme of 'How great thou art' in their addresses to convention.

I thank God for your prayers and words of encouragement and for the faithful service of those who have been called to their heavenly home and pray that you are all given time and good health to serve as sisters in Christ for yet another year in His earthly kingdom.

UPDATE: Immanuel Mission Trip – 17th Nov – 5th Dec 2023

God certainly provided for this team of 17 members – prior to departure and during our time in Uganda. His blessings through people on team and those who supported us before we left was amazing and made the work and projects possible.

The first week was spent working with Lutheran communities in areas north of Jinja



(NE Uganda).Due to the number of congregations, their locality and the not-so-good Ugandan roads, we based ourselves in three main areas – Kamuli, Butagaya and Keyeya. In Kamuli, we were able to bring in Pastors, Evangelists and congregation leaders to a training day where we focused on finance, literacy, relationships and hygiene. We had 82 people attend; some leaving their villages at 4.00am to arrive for the 9.30 start.



In Butagaya there is a Lutheran Primary School, a Congregation and the

beginnings of another sewing business. We had sent funds ahead to help in the establishment of the new sewing room and to pay for some of the women to learn to sew. While we were there, we were able to see what they had begun, speak with the women on the operation of the sewing room and provide a

simple hygiene and a health book for them to use to support their families.

Some of the team spent time weeding the crop area of the land, while others played with the children, talked with the women and provided the evangelist, Daniel, with resources for their school, hoes and seeds for gardening and growing food, funds for food and clothing for those in need. We also met with the congregation chairperson from a few congregations, to hear what their needs are for future planning.

In the second week, we spent time doing Watoto activities. Meeting some of the



vulnerable women in the Neighbourhood Program and being able to bless them with basic support items, (flour, sugar, rice, oil, soap, beans), visiting the baby homes in two of Watoto's villages, bringing donated baby clothes, blankets and toys.

Much of what the team was able to achieve was due to the support – financial and donated items – from congregations and individuals, for which we are very thankful! While all team members pay their own individual costs. the team plans and runs various fundraising events for their identified projects, with all funds going directly to those identified projects. Many of you have supported these events and again, we say thank you! It has meant that they have HOPE and are able to work towards a better life for themselves and their children. On behalf of the Immanuel team, I would like to thank you for your amazing generosity and support. "Follow Me" John: 8:12

A pleasant summer day on 16th Feb 2024, 50 members visitors & Pastors attended the 56th Darling Downs Zone Rally at Haden. The dedicated members of Haden Guild made us all feel welcome and provided a great venue in the church with the beautiful stained-glass windows. The theme was around John 8:12 "Follow Me". After commencing with morning tea, Haden Guild President, Dianne Brown, and LWQDDZ 1st Vice President Cheryl Peters welcomed everyone followed by singing the Theme Song 'Follow Me'.

Pr Mark Demmer (DDZ Counsellor) presented his Devotion on John 8:12 "I am the Light of the World, whoever follows me will not walk in darkness" - We were encouraged to not only *FOLLOW* Christ, but to lead others to Him also. Bible Study was very capably presented by Hazel Weis, based on John 8:12. From William Barclay's study of John's Gospel, he gives the Greek word for 'to follow' (akoloutein) as having five meanings, with the application to Christians as follows:

The Christian is:

- 1. The soldier whose commander is Christ;
- 2. The slave whose joy it is always to serve Christ;
- 3. The man who guides his life and conduct to the counsel of Christ;
- 4. The citizen of the Kingdom of Heaven, and he has accepted the law of the Kingdom and the law of Christ as the law which governs his life; or
- 5. The man who has understood the meaning of the teaching of Christ.

For each meaning, Bible references were given, added to and discussed, then challenged to suggest how do we see a Christian being a follower in this sense today?

Offering of \$755 was shared equally between the new DDZ Project (LCAQD Rural and Regional Hardship Fund), and Uniforms 4 Kids.

Guest Speaker for the day was Anne McDonald, who, as a retired Qld Police Officer (former Assistant Commissioner - Northern Region) co-founded Uniforms 4 Kids. Over 53,500 items of clothing, dolls, 'Hug Me' Bears, library bags, etc. made by over 400 volunteer sewing machine operators, have been donated since its inception. The items



are donated abused to children. children involved in DV, and children affected bν natural disaster. house fires.

etc. All items contain 50% of recycled uniform material, plus discounted or donated new fabric & trims. The services involved in donating the Uniforms include the Qld Police; Aust Federal Police; Australia Zoo; Qld Ambulance; QFES; RFDS; Aust. Border Force; NSW Police & SES; Vic Ambulance.

Dee Challenor welcomed all with the theme "Forgiven Women - Forgive". Devotion and Prayer, followed by singing well known songs. Such joy listening to those singing voices.

Greetings & Apologies. LWQ Pres. Val Kath presented her report. We were privileged to have 4 Zone Presidents in attendance.

Memorial Hymn: "God be with you till we meet again" was sung while candles were lit as we remembered loved ones.

Pastor Stephen Jaensch from Emerald, our SA, led the Bible Study centred on the theme "Forgiven Women - Forgive" It is believed that Thomas Edison made over 1,000 unsuccessful attempts before he successfully invented the light bulb. Everyone told him to stop because he was a failure. But Edison said, "I haven't failed, I've discovered over 1,000 ways in which it isn't done." When he was finally successful in his quest, he gave the working light bulb to a young boy to take upstairs. Accidently the boy dropped it. Edison then had to make another. When the second one was completed, he again asked the boy to take it upstairs. He didn't merely express forgiveness in words, he backed it up with his actions and deeds. Edison is also a picture of great forgiveness.

Afternoon Guest speaker: Angela May delved further into our theme. Angela shared

that "sin" is a word being removed from our everyday language and forgiveness in the world if often not the same as intended by God in showing His grace and mercy to us in Jesus Christ to save us from sin. We are called to forgive sin and hurt against us as we are forgiven by God.

Project speaker: Geoff Hovey (Gramps), representing Clearview Christian College, Tannum Sands, told how a group of young adults wanted to do something for the youth of this area, God giving them the vision to build a Christian School. They faced many challenges to find land, eventually buying a youth camp and converting into their school. The school opened in 2023 with grades 6 & 7, each year adding another class.

This is our <u>local project</u> and received \$1,311 from offerings taken after hearing the Guest speaker. Zone & Guilds contributed \$880. Other contributions by the Zone Guilds and attendees. Zone Project – Far North Qld – earmarked for Wujal Wujal.

Songs of praise ended our day session with Janine Thurecht on the keyboard. Lois Colyer led the closing Devotion and Prayer.

Sat night we were joined by the menfolk, having toured the Gladstone Area Water Board Aquaculture Centre, fish breeding complex and a talk by Ian Anderson about native beehives and how to split a bee hive.
